A new listener needs to hear an interesting voice to make them want to listen so...

Use a child friendly sing-song voice

... use intonation and stress to highlight the important words and phrases.

Pausing before saying the last word in a familiar phrase and looking encouraging gives your child the chance to complete the phrase e.g. "put on you socks and... shoes!" So try to...

Leave a gap at the end

Use learning to listen sounds, words and phrases

Say them with associated phrases, for example not "quack quack" but "quack quack... that was the duck!"

Talk about what is going on

...and about things you are going to do.

Talk about it first

Talking about things before you show them or things you are about to do helps to get your child interested in voices and to attach meaning to sound. **Chit Chat**

Your child needs the opportunity to hear words and phrases many times to develop their listening and language so...

Repeat, rephrase and add new words to what your child says

...this shows your child that you are interested in what they have said and is a great way of building on what they already know.
