

Domain and goal

- Listen to child's jargon and note phonetic content
 - Use the consonant articulation chart
 - Use the vowel & diphthong articulation chart

Activities

In Week 13 you practiced listening to your child and writing down either the language or the speech. This week, listen to your child's spontaneous jargon and note the vowels and consonants he is using. Record these on your articulation attainment charts in the Appendix. If you have a video recorder or a tape recorder, you can record your child and listen/watch it later to complete your record.

Activities:

- Set up a farm yard and animals and invite siblings or nanna to play with your child. Remind them not to do all the talking because you want to record your child's talking. If your child is unusually quiet, join in, use commenting or prompting to facilitate communication. Once he starts talking, pull back, observe and record his spontaneous communication.
