
Questions to ask your hearing health professional





Here are some questions you may want to ask to help you better understand your child's hearing loss and the available treatment options.

- What are the treatment options for my child's hearing loss diagnosis?
- How does my child's hearing loss interact with any other medical conditions they experience?
- Which options are the most effective at restoring hearing?
- How can my child access hearing as early as possible (e.g. if surgery is not yet an option)?
- What should be the most important considerations when choosing the right solution for my child?

- Once we've chosen the right hearing solution for my child, what are the next steps?
- For an implantable solution, what does surgery involve?
- What steps are taken to ensure the surgery goes well?
- What does post-surgery care involve and how long is the recovery?
- What do the next few months after surgery look like?
- How long will it take for my child to adjust to an implantable hearing solution?

- What will hearing rehabilitation involve?
- What steps can I take to give my child the best chance of success with an implantable hearing solution?
- How can an implantable solution improve my child's daily quality of life?
- How can I connect with other families with similar experiences?
